

Before your child can borrow an iPad

Upon delivery of iPad, we ask you kindly to read the terms of Lending on the following pages carefully before signing it.

Fill out the Lending document

Your child can not borrow an iPad, and take it home before you have filled the lending-document and signing it.

Insurance and Liability

The following sections describe insurance conditions and liability:

The municipality's insurance covers the disappearance of the iPad, cover or power cord disappears in the following events

- Home burglary (Signs of breaking of windows, doors, gates, etc.).
- Burglary in the school (Signs of breaking of windows, doors, gates, etc.)
- Ran (Unveiled theft, as noted by the robbed, who thus raising alarm)
- Robbery (The object is taken by violence or threat of violence)

As a parent you are required to document the course of events to the school, and then the school ensures that the municipality's insurance covers it .

The municipality's insurance does not cover

The insurance does not cover the disappearance/loss. Disappearance is where the iPad, cover or power cable has disappeared and it cannot be explained exactly what has happened, and no evidence of an incident is available.

The municipality's insurance covers iPad damage due to external events

In case of damage of the iPad, cover or power cord, the parents must fill and sign an event description that can be used to uncover liabilities. In cases outside the insurance area, the municipality is responsible for iPad, cover or power cable unless the pupil has acted in charge of liability and is therefore liable for damages. Has your child destroyed the equipment intentionally or proved show negligence, so your child and actually you are compensation liable for damages.

Usually, the damages that schoolchildren make surrendered to the parents' home-liability insurance, which also covers the children's responsibility. Please note that not all private liability insurance cover damage of equipment provided by schools.

The following three examples explain the responsibilities.

. Example 1:

If a pupil throws his iPad through the air in the classroom so that it breaks down, the pupil will obviously be responsible for compensation . If the same pupil keeps his iPad correctly in school, but another pupil takes it and throws it as previously indicated, the pupil (the borrower) will not be in the same responsibility. This becomes on the municipality's responsibility, which on the other hand, can make a claim against the pupil who actually threw the iPad.



Example 2:

A pupil cycles in his spar-time with his iPad in the bag, and accidentally falls on the bike. The iPad is broken. The pupil did not drive irresponsibly on the bike, and he did not commit mistakes or negligence in connection with the iPad. The municipality is liable and cannot claim liability against the pupil.

Example 3:

A pupil comes to school and cannot explain where the iPad is. The pupil (Borrower) has to deal with the borrowed item with appropriate care and should normally be able to return it back in substantially the same condition. After all, the pupil will be responsible for damages unless an incidental downfall can be documented (or after the assessment of the school that this is probable).

The delivery and usage of iPad for educational purposes is goverened and covered by the general rules on non-contractual liability – that is to say . The same rules governing liability for the use of other educational materials (books, etc...).

In addition, the responsibility of the pupil / parents is referred to the Ministry of Justice's booklet on children's liability. Scan the code or click on the link to read the booklet

The equipment must be returned to the school on request and without a specified basis, within a period of 2 weeks.

Rules

Some of the important rules which are applicable to all (your own school or class may have/make many rules):

- 1. The iPad is the municipality's property. Students borrow the iPad from Gladsaxe Municipality.
- 2. The iPad must not be lend or transferred to anyone other than the pupil(borrower). In addition, no technical intervention on the iPad may occur and may not be dismantled.
- 3. It is forbidden to jailbreak, hack or otherwise attempt to modify the iPad's operating system.
- 4. It is the pupil's responsibility that the iPad is charged and ready for use when school day starts.
- 5. In the Lending- agreement, the pupil undertakes to delete private content, due to lack of storage space or other conditions, preventing the use of the iPad for educational purposes.



- 6. The pupil must not download or store illegal copyrighted material on the IT equipment such as movies, music, etc.
- 7. The pupil should always accept any security updates for programs and operating systems to keep the IT equipment updated for use in the classroom.
- 8. In case of fault or damage to the iPad, the pupil is required to report this within 14 days to the school *. For insurance reasons, it is important that the iPad is delivered as soon as possible and that the event is described.
- * The schools may even specify contact person, like techniques, the office, teacher
- 9. It's the employee at school who decide when to use the iPad at school.
- 10. The iPad must always be in the cover. If the cover is damaged or lost, a new one must be purchased, see the section about insurance.
- 11. The iPad is delivered with a power supply. If this breaks or disappears, you must obtain a new one, see section about insurance.

This page must be completed/filled and delivered to the school before the iPad is taken.
